ULC Sermon Study Resource Marks of Discipleship: Other Focus Pastor Marcus Lane February 16, 2020

Prayer: Pause for a few moments to go to the Lord in prayer. Ask that He would draw near to you in this time, and open your heart and mind to hear His Word.

Reading: Matthew 20:20-28

Outline:

- I. To be "other focused" is countercultural (v20-23).
 - a. We live in a culture that believes the individual is primary. In media and marketing, everything is aimed at the wants, needs, and desires of the individual.
 - b. This isn't just an American thing, but a human thing; Jesus' own disciples James and John desired places of high honor and glory for themselves in eternity.
- II. Jesus' response to individualism (v25-28)
 - a. Greatness, honor and glory in the kingdom of God look like humble service and self-sacrifice.
 - b. Everything Jesus does is focused on serving, loving, and caring for others. He is glorified because he gave himself up.
- III. We're meant to live with a focus on others.
 - a. We fear that if we focus on others, we'll miss out on something for ourselves. In reality, the opposite is true.
 - b. We discover the truest sense of who we really are when we attach ourselves to serving, caring and giving ourselves away for others like Jesus did.

Reflection/Application Questions:

- 1) How do you try to maintain an "other focus" when life gets busy?
- 2) Have you ever felt like James and John? Do you seek and enjoy power, authority, and recognition in your life? Are these things inherently bad?
- 3) Where are you serving now?
- 4) Are we always to do things for others? What about when we have our own responsibilities to take care of? How do you find that balance in your life?
- 5) Living a live with a focus on others can be tiring. What are some ways you can rest in Jesus and be restored in the midst of your service?
